#### For what purposes do we process your personal data?

Management of internships calls, both curricular and extracurricular, job offers and calls for prizes, addressed to university students, graduates and/or users of the UC Employment Agency. Management and organisation of training activities in competences, skills and/or techniques to search for an employment and self-employment, as well as transversal training actions.

Carrying out labour intermediation activities in accordance with RD 1796/2010, which regulates employment agencies, in development of the Employment Law (Royal Legislative Decree 3/2015, of 23 October, which approves the revised text of the Employment Law).

Professional guidance for employment and employability improvement.

#### Terms and conditions for Data preservation:

Your data will be kept permanently as they are necessary to be able to accredit at any moment your activity developed in our institution in the exercise of our competences as Public Administration.

#### Automated decision-making, personal profiling and applied logic:

Your data will not be subject to a decision based solely on automated processing, including profiling.

#### What is the legitimacy for the processing of your data?



The legal basis your data processing of for the management of student internships is collected in the fulfillment of the functions attributed to the University as a public educational institution in the Organic Law of Universities and its implementing regulations:

- The University Student Statute, approved by RD 1791/2010, in development of article 46.5 of the LOU, recognises the right of students to have the possibility of carrying out academic internships.
- Royal Decree 592/2014, of 11 July, which regulates external academic internships for university students.

In relation to labour intermediation activities, the COIE of the University of Cantabria is recognised as an Employment Agency in accordance with Royal Decree 1796/2010, issued in development of the Employment Law (Royal Legislative Decree 3/2015)

#### To which recipients will your data be communicated?

Your data will be or may be communicated to other public administrations and bodies and to private companies or entities for the exercise of powers related to academic practices, employment or entrepreneurship and compatible with the purpose of the processing.

#### **Data processors:**

#### What are your rights regarding your data processing?

#### How did we get your personal data?

The personal data subject to processing are those that you have provided to us. They may have been provided by other natural persons or Public Administrations (for example, in the case of payroll payments to staff belonging to other entities participating in activities of the University of Cantabria).

The categories of data we process are:

- a) Identification data: ID, name and surname, address, telephone, signature/fingerprint, Social Security/Mutuality number, health card, image/voice, email.
- b) Specially category data:
  - Health (mere concurrence of the condition of disability: it is treated for aggregate and dissociated for statistical purposes of employment of groups with special insertion difficulties).
- c) Other data:
  - Personal characteristics: date of birth, sex.
  - Social circumstances: immigrant status.
  - Academic and professional data: Training and qualifications, professional experience, academic record.
  - Economic, financial and insurance data. Bank details, unemployment data.
