3. COURSE CONTENT.

During this course the student will learn the very basic words and phrases of French in different everyday situations:

- greetings
- numbers telling the time, prices
- most common phrases connected to studying: library, lectures, exercises, seminars, official functions, socialising, life on campus
- everyday practical situations: shopping, food, going to a café/restaurant/bar, buying a train ticket, concert ticket, movie ticket online

They will also get information about French and Belgian culture and society:

- how do we talk to people (formal vs. informal)?
- national idiosyncrasies
