<b>Observations</b>				
Students are required to get a minimum of 5 in the final written exam in order to pass the subject. The marks for the different assessment tasks (writings, oral presentations and oral interview) will only be taken into account if the written exam is passed. In September, the written exam will be 80% of the final grade, while the oral interview and the oral presentations make up the remaining 20% (10% each).				
<b>Observations for part-time students</b>				
Those students who are registered part-time will be assessed on the basis of a written examination, on the one hand, and of an oral interview (10%), on the other hand. The written exam will be longer than that of the students who are registered full-time, so as to cover all the aspects tackled in the subject, and will consist of both theoretical and practical questions. These students will have to contact the lecturers in the first two weeks of the course.
