<b>Observations</b>				
<p>Both the Portfolio and the group work must be delivered on the dates established by the teacher throughout the course. To pass the course students must pass the written exam; therefore, the grades obtained in the Portfolio and the exercises and tests are only added if the exam has been passed. Not passing the course on the January exams, the final grade will be 100 % of the exam in September that will include all aspects covered in the course at a theoretical and practical level. When the course is not passed, because the student did not get the required mark in one or more parts of the assessment, the final mark the student will get will show his/her performance as a whole.</p> <p><b>ORTHOGRAPHY</b> It is assumed that university students have already acquired the linguistic skills required in the correct oral and written expression.
