Observations

To pass the course students must pass both the individual and the collective portfolios . In case of failing either one or both portfolios, students will need to take a final written exam in the extraordinary call. According to Article 35 of the Regulation of the assessment processes at the University of Cantabria, "if a student does not obtain the minimum mark required to pass an evaluation test, the overall mark for the subject will be the lowest value between 4.9 and the weighted average of all the evaluation tests". The assessment system respects Article 17 of the Regulation of the assessment processes at the University of Cantabria, which implies that 40% of the final mark will have been assessed before the lesson period comes ends.

ORTHOGRAPHY:

It is assumed that university students have acquired linguistic abilities in relation to oral and written expression. Therefore, spelling, stress mark, punctuation, grammar and lexical correction in assignments and exams are an obligatory prerequisite to pass the subject.

PLAGIARISM:

Regarding the fraudulent performance in exams and assignments, the final mark complies with the provisions of article 32 of the Regulation of the assessment processes at the University of Cantabria: 'The fraudulent conduct in exams or assignments will be graded as Fail '0' in the subject in the corresponding call, invalidating the marks obtained in all the assessment activities for the extraordinary call'.

Observations for part-time students

Such assessment will involve the completion of a final exam. In any case, students must let their lecturer know their choice within the first two weeks of the semester by sending an email.
