4. OBJECTIVES

The aim of the course is to study the origin and development of Christianity in antiquity in the framework of the Greco-Roman institutions and cultural environment. The course focuses on the analysis of process that led to Christianity from a Jewish religion to an autonomous, universal one, by assimilating of legal, social and religious values prevailing in the Greco-Roman world.

Observations
