- Describe psychosocial variables in terminal illness
- Report about the grief.
- Propose communication skills in the face of death and mourning

The student will be able to identify psychosocial aspects that must be integrated into nursing assessment and care and use psychoemotional skills that will allow him or her to carry out an adequate interaction with individuals and human groups in relation to the health-disease and care process.
