Observations

When a student has not carried out evaluation activities whose weight exceeds 50% of the grade for the subject, they will appear in their minutes as 'not presented'. Observations for part-time students

Those students who are in a part-time regime may benefit from the following system of assessment:

- Carry out the exam exclusively with a percentage weight of 100% or
- Do 50% of the classroom practices with a weight of 20% and the exam with 80%

To take advantage of this evaluation modality, the teaching staff must be informed at the beginning of the course.
