All students are distributed in 5 groups.</p> <p>MEDICAL PRACTICES: from the second half of March to the end of May, students attend for two weeks to practice in the Neurology, Rheumatology, Infectious Diseases and Internal Medicine departments.</p> <p>SURGICAL PRACTICES: from the second half of November until the end of May, students attend for two weeks to the operating rooms or consultations of Neurosurgery, Maxillofacial Surgery and Orthopedic Surgery- Traumatology.</p>
