5	Reading: different text typologies in different textual formats: continuous and discontinuous texts.
6	Communicative Interaction: a) Microfunctions like expressing and discovering attitudes; persuasion, socializing; discourse structuring; communication repair etc and macrofunctions like description; narration; commentary; exposition; explanation; etc.
