4. OBJECTIVES					
<p>Upon successful completion of the course, the student should be able to demonstrate a basic understanding of news relating to the economy as a whole; the economic implications of changes in government fiscal or monetary policy; how interest rates are determined and the role of interest rates in personal and corporate decision-making. In particular, the students should be able to calculate equilibrium national income levels, calculate and use various multipliers, convert nominal values to real values, and use a graph to explain the impact of changes in fiscal and/or monetary policy on income and price levels. In addition, students should be able to use simple models of international trade to study the flow of goods between countries and discuss the costs of protectionism within the context of such models.</p>
