Observations

Teaching will include both theoretical and practical sessions . It may also include participation in complementary activities (conferences, seminars, etc.) organized during the academic year.

The final grade of the course will be the weighted sum of the grades obtained in the theoretical test and in the different programmed practical activities.

This final grade may be weighted with the evaluation of other teaching criteria, among which the participation in complementary activities will be taken into account. The evaluation of these elements will not exceed a maximum of 10% of the value of the student's final grade.

The evaluation activities defined as not recoverable respond to this nature because they are practical training activities of an eminently face-to-face nature or whose realization is contemplated as continuous evaluation to be carried out coinciding with the weeks of teaching of the block".

If the student must attend the extraordinary call, the written exam will have the same percentage value and characteristics as in the ordinary call.

Observations for part-time students
